BLI	4	1833	124	'One Daily School, containing 10 males, is partly supported by a subscription of 7 <i>l.</i> per annum, and partly by payments from the parents of the children.'	
BRI	4	1833	124	'Three Daily Schools: one containing 37 males and 5 females, the other two (commenced about 1831) 4 males and 14 females; the first School is endowed with an allotment of common land, let for 3 <i>l.</i> per annum; with this exception, the instruction in all these Schools is at the expense of the parents.'	
BUT	4	1833	124	'No School in this chapelry.'	
EAG	4	1833	124	'Three Daily Schools: one of which, contains 12 males and 8 females; the master receives an allowance of 7 <i>l.</i> per annum and quarter pence; in the other two Schools, 13 males and 18 females are instructed, at the expense of their parents. – One Sunday School, of 20 males and 30 females (commenced 1832), is supported by subscription, and has a lending Library attached.'	
EMB	4	1833	124	'Two Daily Schools (one of which commenced in 1831) containing 42 males and 35 females, who are instructed at the expense of their parents.'	
GRA	4	1833	124	'Three Daily Schools: one of which, containing 21 males and 10 females, is endowed with 15 <i>l.</i> per annum, arising from lands let out by the Commissioners under an Inclosure Act for inclosing common lands in this Township, and is further supported by payments from the children; another contains 18 males and 12 females; the other 3 males and 14 females; in the two last Schools the children are instructed wholly at the expense of their parents. The two first mentioned Schools commenced about 1829.'	
MOS	4	1833	124	'No School in this chapelry.'	
SET	4	1833	124	'Two Daily Schools: one, containing 25 of both sexes, is endowed by ancient School Stock, with 1 <i>l.</i> 15 <i>s.</i> per annum, and by a late Inclosure Act with land, let a few years ago upon an improvable lease of 21 years, at 21 <i>l.</i> , the children also pay a small quarterage: the other (commenced 1832), contains 15 females, and is partly supported by a salary allowed by Lady F.F. Vane, and partly by payment of 1 <i>d.</i> per week from each child. – One Sunday School, wherein 30 of both sexes receive gratuitous instruction.'	
WHI	4	1833	124	'No School in this township.'	
DEA	4	1833	128	'... including BRANTHWAITE, ULLOCK, PARDSEY and DEAN SCALES, Townships (Pop.866) – Three Daily Schools, respectively containing 45, 35 and 30 children of both sexes; the first School is endowed with 10 <i>l.</i> per annum; with this exception, the instruction in all is at the expense of the parents; the last school commenced in 1819.'	
BRA	4	1833	132	'No School in this township.'	
LOR	4	1833	133	'Two Daily Schools: one, containing 21 males and 6 females, is endowed with 4 <i>l.</i> 10 <i>s.</i> per annum; the other, 7 males and 17 females; with the exception of the above small endowment, the instruction in both Schools is at the expense of the parents. – One Sunday School, attended by 50 children of both sexes, is supported by subscription. The Sunday School, with a few exceptions, composes the children in the two Daily schools.'	
WHT	4	1833	133	'No School in this Chapelry.'	
LOW	4	1833	133	'... including MOCKERKIN (Pop. 454.) – Two Daily Schools: one, containing 10 males and 11 females, is partly supported by an endowment of 8 <i>l.</i> 8 <i>s.</i> per annum, and partly by payments from the parents of the children; in the other, 20 males and 18 females are instructed wholly at the expense of the parents.'
